- **What does “poetic beauty” mean?**

Excellence in style and expression.

Poetry that forms, sustains, and delights us.

- **Who is Homer?**

Ans:

Ancient Greek epic poet, author of The Iliad and The Odyssey.

- **What is a “touchstone”?**

Ans:

A stone used to test gold’s purity.

- **What is the “touchstone” in literary criticism?**

Ans:

A standard to judge a literary work’s greatness.

- **How can we apply the touchstone method?**

Ans:

Compare new poetry with great lines from past poets.

- **How is poetry greater than history?**

Ans:

Poetry expresses universal truths; history deals with facts only.

- **What is diction?**

Ans:

The writer’s choice of words.

- **What is romance poetry?**

Ans:

Medieval love poetry from France, also called Troubadour poetry.

- **What is “chivalry”?**

Ans:

Knightly qualities like courage, honour, loyalty, and kindness.

- **What is Chaucer's attitude to life?**

Ans:

Large, free, simple, and kind-hearted.

- **How does Chaucer present human life?**

Ans:

With variety, showing both good and evil kindly.

- **Who was Gower?**

Ans:

A poet of Chaucer's time, author of Confessio Amantis.

- **When does a poet achieve "high seriousness"?**

Ans:

When treating a serious subject simply and intensely.

- **Who was Cowley?**

Ans:

A 17th-century metaphysical poet and essayist.

- **Who was Chapman?**

Ans:

Early Elizabethan poet, famous for translating Homer.

- **What is the difference between Pope's/Dryden's poetry and genuine poetry?**

Ans:

Genuine poetry comes from the soul; theirs came from wit.

- **What is Arnold's opinion about Robert Burns?**

Ans

: His Scottish poems are brilliant; his English poems are less great.

- **What does Arnold mean by "Poetry is a criticism of life"?**

Ans:

Poetry reflects and judges life's ideas.

- **Who are Arnold's ideal poets?**

Ans:

Homer, Dante, Shakespeare, and Milton.

- **What is the function of poetry?**

Ans:

To serve the needs of human life.

Judging a work by its historical importance.
