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When was Burke elected a member of the British Parliament?

Ans: In 1774.

When and why did Burke lose his seat in the Parliament?

Ans: Hafiz Rhamat Khan (1710-74) was a leading Rohilla chief and one of the bravest men of his time.

How was the English behavior towards the Indians?
