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In "Where the Mind is Without Fear" (1910), Rabindranath Tagore (1861-1941) paints a beautiful dream of freedom and progress. The poem is like a prayer for his country. He wishes for a world of unity, truth, and reason. Tagore speaks to God. He asks for guidance to lead people toward this ideal.

Poet's Position - Subjective: Tagore writes from a personal and heartfelt point of view. He dreams of a better world, especially for India, during its struggle for independence. His vision is personal yet universal. He speaks of freedom, not just political but also intellectual and spiritual. The poet expresses his own hopes and beliefs. He shares what he feels is necessary for a nation to grow and prosper. This makes his position subjective, as it comes from his inner desires.

Poet's Attitude - Optimistic and Spiritual: Tagore's attitude is hopeful and positive. He believes that people can rise above fear, division, and ignorance. He is optimistic that truth, knowledge, and reason can lead humanity forward. At the same time, his tone is spiritual and humble. He prays to God for guidance. This shows his faith in divine power. Tagore is also determined. He wants his country to awaken into a "**heaven of freedom.**" His words are full of love and care for his people and the world.
