

Write a Summary of the Poem “Stopping by Woods on a Snowy Evening”.

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In Robert Frost's (1874-1963) “Stopping by Woods on a Snowy Evening” (1923), the poet describes a quiet moment of reflection as he watches snowfall in a secluded forest.
