Title: Introduction **Poet:** William Blake (1757-1827) **Publication:** The poem was published in Blake's Songs of Experience in 1794. **Form:** Four five-line stanzas **Rhyme Scheme:** Each stanza has a rhyme scheme of ABAAB

Important Note: This poem introduces the poet of this collection ("Songs of Experience"). Blake says this poet is called the Bard. The Bard can see the past, present, and future. He has heard the holy voice of God. It means that the Bard or poet is like a prophet. He has divine revelation/wisdom. The Bard will write down his words/poems in the "Songs of Experience." And in this collection, the poet/Bard will ask human souls to return to the path of light, truth, and goodness. Because humanity is in darkness.
