

"Ode to a Nightingale" Summary

The poem "Ode to Nightingale" was written by the Romantic Poet John Keats. It was published in 1819. In this poem, the poet has resorted to his imagination to escape worldly life's problems.

Hearing and Appreciating Nightingale's Song: At the poem's beginning, the poet says that he feels faint and his chest hurts. Because a little while ago, he consumed drugs. At that moment, he heard the nightingale's song in the distant forest. The nightingale's summer song delights him, and he admires her melodious song.

The Poet's Longing to Go to Nightingale's Earth: The poet then longs for a drug that will make him forget everything. Removes all limitations. The poet wants to forget everything in the world and go to the dense forest with the nightingale, to go to the nightingale's world. In the third stanza, the poet wants to get lost. The Speaker wants to eliminate all the problems in life that the Nightingale doesn't have. He knows nothing is permanent. Beauty will fade one day. In the fourth stanza, the poet asks the nightingale to fly, and he will follow him. He wants to get lost in poetry rather than in drugs. He imagines that he is flying in the forest with the nightingale. The moonlight is hidden behind the trees in that forest.

Nightingale's Song Touching the Heart: The poet says he cannot see the flowers in this light but can imagine their beauty. The poet listens to the nightingale in the darkness in the sixth stanza. This song touches him so much that even if he dies in the middle of this song, he will feel joy.

Immortality to Nightingale and Return to Reality: In the seventh stanza, the poet says that Nightingale is not mortal. He was not born to die. Everyone has been listening to his songs since ancient times. His song can be heard even in the stormy sea or in the realm of fairies. Then, the poet regained consciousness, hearing a sound, and the nightingale flew away. Nightingale could not remember whether it was her imagination or a dream. So he continued to regret it. He couldn't even remember if he was awake or asleep.
