

She Stoops to Conquer Themes

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Mistaken Identity and Deception: Mistaken identity is an important theme in this play. Marlow and Hastings think Hardcastle's house is an inn because of Tony's trick. Marlow mistakes Kate for a barmaid. The main confusion leads to funny and awkward situations.
