- **Structure:** 5 stanzas
- **Tone:** Intense, reflective, and philosophical
- **Genre:** Symbolic and metaphysical poem
- **Subject:** The mysterious natural force that gives life and also brings death
- **Central Idea:** The same life energy that makes the flower grow also causes its decay; this same force flows through all living things — plants, humans, and nature alike.
- **Theme:** Unity of life and death, power of nature, connection between man and nature, time and mortality, creation and destruction.
- **Imagery:** Strong natural images — *flower, root, green fuse, water, mouth, youth, death* — symbolizing life's continuous cycle.
- **Symbolism:** "Green fuse" symbolizes the vital energy or life-force running through all creation.
- **Message:** Life and death are not separate; they are part of one eternal natural process driven by the same unseen force.
