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Themes

- **Waiting:** The biggest theme of the play is about waiting. Vladimir and Estragon wait for someone named Godot, but he never comes. We never know who Godot is. This shows how people wait for meaning or answers in life, but they may never get them. The play says life can feel empty when we just wait and do nothing.
- **Friendship and Loneliness:** Vladimir and Estragon are always together. They fight, they joke, but they never leave each other. Their friendship helps them survive the long, boring wait. The play shows that friendship can make life less lonely, even when nothing changes.
- **Time and Repetition:** In the play, every day feels the same. The two men repeat the same words and actions. This makes time feel strange and slow. The play shows how life can feel like a circle when nothing new happens.
- **Hope and Hopelessness:** Vladimir and Estragon keep hoping Godot will come. But he never does. They think about leaving or ending their lives, but they keep waiting. The play shows how people can keep hope alive, even when there is no clear reason.
